Bibliography

PDF Fulltext

The majority of the material provided here is based on the so-called "historical bibliographies" of medieval travel accounts that have been edited under the direction of Prof. Werner Paravicini and published by Peter Lang. Initially, bibliographies of German, French and Italian travel accounts have been published, but there was always the idea of including material for the other European countries (especially Italy, England, Spain, Portugal, Scandinavia and East-Central as well). Digitization is therefore done in parallel also for countries from those countries that are lacking.

News

Site is used

Travelers are classified by their native countries. The location of the location itself was not a structural concern of the bibliographer. Drop down lists on the left provide access to the travelers from different countries and their itineraries (up to 10% of all travelers in the database). The database can be used as a bibliography on travel and pilgrimages in the digital map of Europe. The website also provides a PDF-Fulltext of the original text. Reproduction, Copy, Print, Copy and Paste are not possible. The use of the website is free of charge. (Since a "Business Model" is the subject of an ongoing discussion. For the use of the material on the website, a license of the material is provided, for the original text, the user must see the keywords in context (KWIC), when using the website for reference.

Disclaimer

Due to the origin of the material that was originally not collected for digitalization, the quality of PDF-files may vary from time to time. "Historical OCR" results can be very poor in some cases. Please be aware that in some cases reading will be difficult. We make a list for a particular word or phrase that may not be found in the original text. Reproduction, Copy, Print, Copy and Paste are not possible with OCR. Another limitation is the referencing page standard of bibliographical references. These references were widely used in the published full text. We used to collect data for the printed versions of the "Analytical Bibliographies of Travel Accounts of the Late Middle Ages".

- Building on analytical Bibliographies of late medieval travel accounts (1994-2001).

- Itineraries manually extracted from travelogues, geocoding and visualization through google maps API. Dragable markers for easy error correction (since 2014). List of placenames etc.
- 2007 – 2019 database serial full text search in Editions and research literature – KWIC and hit count for copyright protected texts.
- Planned for 2020: index based search (solr) on copyright free material.

- Digital tools: minimizing manual correction – maximizing the coverage of the material - accepting (some) error in OCR and NER
 1. Named Entity Recognition with [Open Semantic Search](#) (Spacy)
 2. Building facets with controlled vocabulary (PlaceNames, Persons, Topics)
 3. When training material is ready, continue and improve NER with DL



- State of the project: application phase – funding needed to experiment with CNN NER and adopt Open Semantic Search for our needs
- Full text search and KWIC / faceted search via Open Semantic Search can be implemented via iframe. All other services (itineraries, visualization, identifications etc.) can only be implemented with funding!
